PAUL IS A PRISONER – BUT GOD'S WORD IS FREE!

Acts 21:31-33 & 22:30 & 23:23-24 & 24:1-27 & 25:2-11 & 27:1 & 28:14-30

21:31The people were trying to kill Paul in Jerusalem. 32So the Roman commander came running – 33and the commander arrested Paul. 22:30The Jews were accusing Paul. 23:23-24So the commander sent Paul to the Roman Governor in Caesarea [a Roman city over 100 kilometers northwest of Jerusalem]. 24:1The Jewish High Priest and a lawyer also went to Caesarea. 2The lawyer said to the Governor, 5"Paul makes trouble everywhere in the world." 13Paul answered, "That is not true. The Jews cannot prove it – I did not make trouble."

27But the Governor kept Paul in prison for 2 years. Then there was a new governor. 25:2The High Priests accused Paul again. 8Then Paul answered, "I have done nothing bad – not against the Jewish law – not against God's temple – not against the Roman Emperor Caesar. 11So, Governor, you cannot hand me over to the Jewish court.

Paul said, "I appeal to Emperor Caesar – I want to go to Caesar's court in Rome." 12The Governor said, "To Caesar you will go." 27:1-2So Paul and other prisoners got on a ship. 28:14[Finally, after a very bad storm and a shipwreck] Paul got to Rome.

28:16In Rome, Paul could live in a [rented] house – but a soldier guarded Paul. 17Three days later, Paul invited the Jewish leaders to his house. 23From morning to evening Paul talked about God's kingdom. Paul talked about Jesus. He said: The Old Testament says that Jesus is the Messiah.

24Some Jewish leaders believed in Jesus. Some Jewish leaders did not believe in Jesus. 25The Jewish leaders argued with each other.

Paul said to the Jewish leaders:

26'You will listen and listen [to God's Word], but you will never understand. You will look and look [for God], but you will never see.

27Your hearts are hard.

You hear only a little.

You have closed your eyes.

So you don't see – you don't hear – you don't understand.

So you do not repent – and God does not save you.'

28"So I want you Jewish leaders to know this: God has sent his salvation to the Gentiles – God will save Gentiles. And the Gentiles will listen!"

30For two years Paul lived in his rented house. He welcomed everyone who came to his house. Boldly and freely he told about God's kingdom – and he taught about Jesus.

ABOUT 3 YEARS LATER, PAUL WRITES ...

2 Timothy 4: 6-8

6"It is time for me to die – I will leave this earth and go to heaven. 7 I fought hard for Jesus. I finished the race. I believed God's Word – I kept my faith in Jesus.

8So, on the Day of Judgment, God will give me the Crown of Goodness – but not only to me. The Crown of Goodness is for everyone – it is for all people who believe in Jesus – for all people who eagerly wait for Jesus to come back to earth."
