AN ETHIOPIAN OFFICIAL READS ABOUT JESUS

1

Acts 8:1, 4 (Review)

8:1A big persecution started in Jerusalem – the persecution was against the believers in Jesus. So they ran away from Jerusalem. 4And, everywhere the believers went, the believers told everyone about Jesus.

Acts 8:26-40

26An angel from God said to Philip, "Go south. Go to the desert road."

27-28So Philip went south. On the way he saw an Ethiopian man. The man was very important. He worked for Candace, the queen of Ethiopia. The man took care of all the queen's treasures.

This man was going home to Ethiopia. He was going home from Jerusalem. In Jerusalem he had worshiped at Creator God's temple. Now, he was riding home to Ethiopia in a chariot. And he was reading the Old Testament – he was reading a true story that was about 700 years old.

29God's Spirit said to Philip, "Go to that chariot." 30So Philip ran up to the chariot. The man was reading the Old Testament out loud – and Philip heard the man reading.

Philip asked the man, "Do you understand it? Do you understand what you are reading?" 31"I cannot understand it," the man said, "Please, explain it to me." So Philip sat with the man in his chariot.

32-33The Ethiopian man was reading:

"He was like a sheep – he was like a sheep to be killed.
He was like a lamb – he was silent like a lamb – and he said nothing.
People shamed him.
People treated him unfairly.
People killed him."

34The Ethiopian man asked Philip, "Who is he?"

35Philip told the man about Jesus:

[*He* is Jesus. Jesus is the lamb – he died on the cross for everyone. Then Jesus became alive again. So, everyone who believes in Jesus will live forever.]

36The chariot came to some water beside the road. The Ethiopian man said, "I want to be baptized. 38Stop the chariot." Then Philip and the man went down into the water. And Philip baptized the Ethiopian man [because the man believed in Jesus].

39They came out of the water. Then God's Spirit took Philip away – Philip was gone. The Ethiopian man did not see Philip again. But the man was very happy and went home to Ethiopia.

40Then Philip went to many towns – he told many people the good news about Jesus.
