ABRAHAM'S SON ISAAC NEEDS A WIFE Genesis 23:1-2 & 24:1-67 & 25:20

23:1Isaac's mother Sarah lived to be 127 years old. 2Then she died in Canaan. [Isaac was 37 years old. (Genesis 17:17)]

24:1Now Abraham was very old – and Creator God had blessed Abraham in every way. 2 Abraham's head servant was in charge of everything that Abraham owned. So Abraham said to his head servant, 3"I am living in Canaan now. But please swear to me by God of heaven and earth. Swear that you will get a wife for Isaac – but you will not get a Canaanite wife for him. 4Instead, you will go back to my relatives – and you will get a wife for Isaac from my relatives.

5The head servant said to Abraham, "But maybe the woman will not want to live in Canaan. What should I do then? Should I take your son back to your relatives?" 6"No, never!" said Abraham, "Do not take my son back to my relatives. 7The God of heaven brought me from my father's family – and he brought me to Canaan. The God of heaven swore to me and promised: 'I will give Canaan to your descendants.' The God of heaven will help you get a wife from my relatives for my son."

9So the head servant swore it to Abraham. 10Then the servant took ten of Abraham's camels – and the servant took many good gifts from Abraham. Then he went (about 800 kilometers / 500 miles north) to the town of Nahor (but he did not know where Abraham's relatives lived).

11Outside the town there was a well – and the head servant stopped by the well. It was evening. In the evening the women from Nahor came to the well to get water. 12Then the head servant prayed, "God of my master Abraham, please help me be successful today – and please be kind to my master Abraham."

13He prayed to God, "Look! The girls from Nahor are coming to the well to get water. 14(I will do a test.) I will ask a girl, 'Please give me a drink of water.' If she says, 'I will give you a drink,' and if she also says, 'I will water your camels too' – I will know that she is the girl you have chosen for Isaac."

15-16While the head servant was still praying, Rebekah came to the well with her water jar on her shoulder. Then she filled her jar with water. (The head servant did not know it, but) Rebekah was the daughter of Isaac's cousin. She was very beautiful, and she was a virgin.

17The servant ran to meet her and said, "Please give me a drink from your jar." 18So Rebekah gave him a drink of water. 19Then she said, "I will water your camels, too – I will get water until your camels are finished drinking." 20So she quickly emptied her jar into the trough for animals. [One camel can drink 100 to 200 liters / 25 to 50 gallons of water!] Then she ran back to the well – and she got water for all his camels. 21The head servant was watching her quietly – and he was wondering: Has God given me success? – Is she the wife for Isaac?

22Finally, the camels stopped drinking – and the servant gave Rebekah a gold nose ring and two gold bracelets. 23-24Then the servant asked, "Whose daughter are you?" Rebekah told the servant her father's name – (her father was Abraham's nephew!) And the head servant asked Rebekah, "Please, can we stay at your father's house tonight?" 25And she said, "At our house we have straw and food for your camels. And you can stay at our house tonight."

26Then the head servant bowed down and worshiped the God of heaven and earth. 27He said, "Praise God – praise the God of my master Abraham. God is still kind and faithful to my master. And God has helped me – God led me to the house of my master's relatives."

32Then the head servant went to Rebekah's house – 33and they served him food. But the head servant said, "I cannot eat yet. First, I must tell you my purpose." 34Then he said, "I am Abraham's servant. (35-48And he told Rebekah's father and brother Laban the whole story.) 49Then the head servant asked Rebekah's father and brother, "Will you show kindness to my master Abraham – will you give Rebekah to Isaac? Will you say yes? Or will you say no?"

50Rebekah's brother and father answered, "This is from God. 51Take Rebekah – and she can become Isaac's wife. This is God's plan." 52Then Abraham's servant bowed down to the ground before Creator God. 53Then the servant gave gold and silver jewelry and clothes to Rebekah. And he gave expensive gifts to Rebekah's brother and her mother.

54Then Abraham's servant ate and drank, and he stayed there that night. The next morning he got up and said, "Send me back to my master." 58Then Rebekah's family asked her, "Will you go with this man?" And Rebekah answered, "I will go." 61So Rebekah and her servant girls got ready to go. Then they got on their camels and went back to Canaan with Abraham's servant.

67Then Isaac married Rebekah, and he loved her. And Isaac was comforted after his mother's death.

25:20Isaac was 40 years old when he married Rebekah.

Deuteronomy 7:3-4
